GCP&T ACCOMPLISHMENTS – SECOND QUARTER 2023

Greene County Parks & Trails has been busy this past quarter! We are proud to share the following accomplishments:

- Caesar Ford Park campground phase I completed, phase II started, phase III awarded; water and sewer lines installed.
- **Twin Towers** new fence installed around show and dressage rings; judges stands rebuilt.
- Xenia-Jamestown Connector progress trees, ditches, and erosion areas.
- Hobson Freedom Park completed drainage work for cricket field.
- Constitution Park poured new approach/ramp to the river.

- Spring Lakes Park bank stabilization and trail work finished; Critter Cove nature center painted, cages installed, animals moved from old nature center.
- Parking Lots & Driveways with funds secured from ODOT and Ohio Parks and Recreation Association (OPRA), new parking lots added:
 - Caesar Ford Park New Jasper Station Road
 - McCalmont Park new park to open later this year
 - Hebble Creek Reserve
- Creekside Trail seal coating completed.
- Wright Brothers Huffman Prairie Bikeway completed brush removal.
